All household goods and personal effects items dutiable, except used personal effects (clothing and toilet articles). Antiques with a certificate of authenticity from an authorized dealer or expert. Duty may become payable on an assessed value at the Customs Officer's discretion. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The most common charges that a transferee may incur is 35% duty + 7% stamp tax. (Duty and stamp tax are on a C.I.F. value).
Prohibited items	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Weapons and ammunition. Drugs. Plants (Health Certificate required) Pornography. Articles contrary to Bahamian religious beliefs or morality will not be allowed into the country.

Motor vehicles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Copy of auto title is required. An invoice is required for recently purchased autos. Value of \$10,000 or less-45% duty + 7% stamp tax. Value of \$10,000-\$20,000-50% duty + 7% stamp tax. Value over \$20,000-65% + 7% stamp tax.
